What does love look like? We can probably identify when we see someone acting in a loving way, or we can see some people 'in love'. We might suggest that a red heart represents love, but actually saying what love looks like is more complicated.

If we think of love as an emotion then it is really difficult to describe as emotions don't have a shape or form. But the love we think of when it comes to God is not an emotion or a feeling. It's an action. And it's even more than that: the Bible says that God is love. Love is the true essence of God.

And in Jesus God has made that love knowable. Our Christmas publicity (on the next page) this year includes the invitation to 'Come and look into the face of love.' In the face of a child born in squalid circumstances in a tiny village in an occupied country we see what love looks like. Love looks like Jesus.

We discover that truth in one of the most amazing names given to describe Jesus – 'Immanuel', which means 'God with us'. God came into the world to show us what love looks like, to be with us and enable people to experience that love. We can still experience that love through faith in Jesus: by his Spirit, as we read the Bible and pray, and through his people – us, the church.

My prayer for all of us this Christmas is that everyone connected with this church in some way will see and experience God's love afresh in and through us. Do take invitation cards to share with your friends and family and bring them along to some of our events.

A HUUUGE 'Thank you'

In their accounts of Jesus' life his biographers tell us that he took five small loaves of bread and two fish and, having given God thanks for them, fed a vast crowd of over 5,000 people with them. It seems incredible, doesn't it?

God is doing a similar miracle today - taking the money that you donate and transforming it so that people are fed and clothed, so that children, young people families have a place to come and enjoy themselves, so that people can grow in their faith in Jesus, and so much more. We want to say 'thank you' to you for the financial gifts that you have given to the church this year as an act of worship to God. **Your giving has enabled us to:**

Provide about **100 Sunday services** (including on Zoom in the mornings). **Baptise 6 people.** Run **Being With** and **User's Guide to the Bible** courses.

Serve over **2,000 hot meals** and **900 subsidised bags of food** at Bigger Table on Thursday lunchtimes. Over **1000 cups of tea and coffee** (plus cakes!) were served at Cosy Corner on Tuesdays

Give out over **4,200 hot drinks and food** to homeless people through Soup Run on Wednesday evenings

Provide at least **4,700 places for children and families** to come and enjoy our facilities at Buzzy Bees and Baby Bees on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays

Cook over **1,100 meals** for families at Lighthouse Café, provide **810 places** at **Supernova and Mutley Youth** on Thursday evenings and run a **Holiday Club** during the summer attended by **38 children**

Ensure that the church **buildings are well-maintained** and improved and **hire out or provide rooms** for Plymouth Focus, Gifted Women, 2 choirs, Plymouth Birders, Old Plymouth and Plymouth Egyptology Society, as well as many others on a less regular basis

Directly support overseas and UK mission with grants

All of this, and so much more, has only been possible because of your generous gifts and support this year. Thank you so much.
